Jesus taught in Matthew 13:44 that his kingdom is hidden in what appears to be very ordinary: a field, an *agros*. We believe his kingdom is still hidden today in ordinary places, often called the ordinary means of grace: The Word, prayer, fellowship, and ordinances. And so, those who have found his hidden treasure have always been marked by extraordinary devotion to these ordinary means (see Acts 2:42).

But it's so easy for that devotion to falter. Our churches' mission—to be in the world, but not of the world—requires constant vigilance against the world's schemes. The world tempts us, promising more appealing or more successful alternatives to the means of grace. The world also hates us, calling into question whether the means of grace are sufficient for our survival. Surely there is a more strategic way to strengthen and spread churches in such a world than to call for more devotion to these ordinary means... We don't think so.

We believe we should bank everything on these ordinary means with joy because of what faith is.


If our faith is what overcomes the world (1 John 5:4), and if our faith seizes the treasure of Christ *through* the ordinary means of grace, then may nothing distract us from that devotion! Our conference aims to fill up our faithful devotion to these ordinary means of grace by proclaiming what biblical faith is: The Faith that Finds the Treasure. We believe the churches who will overcome the world are those whose faith held fast to this treasure through earnest devotion to the ordinary means of grace.



prayer is that you will not come away exasperated that you simply don't have time to put into practice all that this book commends. Rather, in its very structure, the book aims to help you see how realistic and life-giving it can be to integrate God's means of grace into daily habits of life.' In that regard he succeeds well. This book really could set you up for a lifetime of enjoying God through the means he provides. Mathis also succeeds in giving new enthusiasm to those of us who already have well-established patterns of participating in each of these means of grace. I read the Bible and pray daily; I am committed to my church and heavily involved in it. Yet *Habits of Grace* still challenged me to continue to grow in each of these ways. The biblical support was challenging and the practical tips were illuminating. Both gave me ideas and information for modifying and improving my commitment to those all-important means of grace."

Faith-Filling Discipleship w/ Brandon Tackett Main Sanctuary
What should discipleship look like in a church? Is it scheduled, structured,
one-on-one meetings with lots of study, teaching, and prayer? Or is it
spontaneous, free-flowing interactions that overflow throughout everyday life?
When we aim for faith-filling discipleship, we choose both. They are like two
pedals on the same bicycle. On one hand, faith is filled by deliberate attention:
studying the Word, learning, confessing sin, challenging one another. Faith is
filled by intentionally spending time in the ordinary means of grace together.
But since it is faith that we are filling not just our minds it must also be lived
out in our everyday life. When faith is full, it moves into others' lives with love
and holiness and service, discipling them by example. Come discuss how to
disciple with both pedals in your church from the faith-filling words of 2 John.

Faith-Filling Prayer w/ Bob Flack Multipurpose Room

Paul commanded the Christians at Rome to "be constant in prayer" (Romans 12:12). Christians know such advice is more easily offered than obeyed. Consistent, constructive praying is a difficult discipline to develop. But the Lord has not left us to fail. This breakout session will demonstrate for you the practice of praying Scripture and a practical tool to help you, in Jesus's words, "always to pray and not lose heart" (Luke 18:1). Come and find encouragement to model this means of grace in your church.

Faith-Filling Worship Services w/ Joe Bridgman Lunch Area

Does your faith get everything it should out of your church's worship services? Do you often walk away dissatisfied, wishing your worship service did more for you? And is the problem your expectations or your church's worship service? God's Word can help. God has not left us on our own to discover the most gratifying worship experience we can imagine. His Word actually guides us, because he is the one seeking out worshipers to worship him in spirit and truth (John 4:23-24). We will look in God's Word for guidance on what kind of worship fills our God-given faith and what kind of worship only gratifies our flesh-driven desires. My aim is to help us grow in our appreciation of how worship services filled with the ordinary means of grace can fill up our faith.
